Subj: Re-Introduction of 2016 Federal Executive Board Leadership

It is with pleasure that I introduce to you the leadership of the Federal Executive Board for 2016. Since I last sent you this in January we had a transfer outside the L.A. Area – we have a new Chair-Elect! I encourage you to make contact with the Board of Directors to offer your suggestions on ways we may best serve your agency. A brief biographical sketch of the 2016 Chair, Chair-Elect and Vice Chair follows:



David Shinn, FEB Chair, presently serves as Warden of the Metropolitan Detention Center, Los Angeles, California. Mr. Shinn assumed the responsibilities of Chief Executive Officer, in June 2014, as the 5th Warden of the institution which has operated in service and support of the Central District of California since 1988.

Mr. Shinn began his career with the Federal Bureau of Prisons in February 1991, as a Legal Technician/Correctional Officer at the Metropolitan Correctional Center, San Diego, CA and Federal Correctional Institution, Fairton, NJ. His career progressed with the Federal Bureau of Prisons leading to positions of increasing responsibility as a Supervisory Correctional Officer and Assistant Chief Records Officer at the Federal Correctional Institution, Fort Dix, NJ; as Chief Records Officer, Federal Correctional Institution, Terminal Island, CA; as Federal Bureau of Prisons Accreditation Manager (American Correctional Association) in the External Auditing Branch and as Liaison to the Bureau's Executive Staff in the Planning and Analysis Branch, Central Office, Washington, DC; as Associate Warden at the United States Penitentiary, Atwater, CA; and as Associate Warden at the Metropolitan Detention Center, Los Angeles, CA. Mr. Shinn joined the ranks of the Senior Executive Service upon his selection as Warden at the Metropolitan Detention Center, Los Angeles California. In this capacity, he is responsible for managing a complement of more than 280 sworn law enforcement personnel and the daily oversight of an average daily inmate population of 1000. Prior to this assignment, Mr. Shinn served as Warden of the Federal Detention Center in Honolulu, HI, from April 2012 to June 2014. During this assignment, Mr. Shinn had the opportunity to work closely with the Honolulu-Pacific Federal Executive Board and to serve as a member of their Executive Committee. Prior to the start of his career with the Federal Bureau of Prisons, Mr. Shinn began his career in government service by joining the United States Marine Corps in March 1987. While serving in the military, he attended Palomar College where he pursued a degree in Criminal Justice.



Glen Martin, FEB Chair Elect, presently serves as the Federal Aviation Administration's (FAA) Regional Administrator for the Western-Pacific Region. The region includes four states; Hawaii, California, Nevada and Arizona, and three territories; Guam, Northern Mariana Islands and American Samoa. Mr. Martin assumed these duties in September, 2014. He serves as the FAA's Senior Executive in the region and is responsible for linking FAA national programs to state and local entities as well as communities. He also presents the Agency, serving as the focal point for outside stakeholders to voice aviation issues and concerns with the FAA.

Prior to this position, Mr. Martin was the Terminal District Manager for the Lake Effect District in Northern Illinois and Wisconsin, this includes the Chicago O'Hare Airport. He has also been the Air Traffic Manager at the New York, Cleveland and Chicago Air Route Traffic Control Centers. Earlier in his career he held positions at the Great Lakes Region and at FAA headquarters in the Airspace Management and Air Traffic Operations Programs, and at the Air Route Traffic Control System Command Center.

Mr. Martin began his career in 1988 at the Kansas City Downtown Tower. Originally from Kansas City, he received a BSBA degree from the University of Missouri majoring in Finance and Banking. He later received an MBA from Strayer University graduating with honors. In 2012, he received the Air Traffic Control Association's General E.R. Quesada Memorial Award. This is a Medallion Award presented to an individual for an outstanding achievement as an Air Traffic Manager.



Victor Parker, FEB Vice Chair, a California native and long-time member of the Los Angeles community, was appointed the District Director of the SBA's Los Angeles District Office in October, 2011. The Los Angeles District Office serves Los Angeles, Ventura, and Santa Barbara counties. As District Director, he is responsible for the delivery of SBA programs and services to aspiring and existing small business owners, SBA lenders and partners, which include business advisory services, capital access programs, entrepreneurial development, international trade development and contract procurement assistance. The Los Angeles District Office territory includes ten Small Business Development Centers, three Service Corps of Retired Executives chapters and four Women's Business Centers.

Prior to joining the SBA, Victor worked in various capacities as a small business manager and corporate executive for nearly 20 years. His responsibilities included managing regulatory affairs, intellectual property licensing agreements, and contract negotiations. As his career advanced, he also gained expertise in small business joint venture manufacturing with in-depth consulting agreements, and supplier diversity development and expansion. He has experience with SBA programs from the small business side, government contracting and the 8(a) certification process in particular. In addition to Victor's broad management and leadership experience in the private sector, he is actively engaged in serving several civic, nonprofit and community-based organizations in the Southern California area, including serving on the Civil Service Commission, Sustainable City Committee and on the Board of Directors of the Community Development Centers, Inc. Victor earned his Bachelor's Degree from the University of California at Berkeley and Juris Doctor from Pepperdine University School of Law.
