Subj: Introduction of 2019 Federal Executive Board Leadership

It is with pleasure that I introduce to you the leadership of the Federal Executive Board for 2019. I encourage you to make contact with the Board of Directors to offer your suggestions on ways we may best serve your agency. A brief biographical sketch of the 2019 Chair, Chair-Elect and Vice Chair follows:



Lorenzo Davis, FEB Chair, presently serves as the General Service Administration's (GSA) Los Angeles Service Center Director for the Pacific-Rim Region. Mr. Davis assumed these duties in May, 2015 and as Director manages GSA Federal Owned property and GSA Lease Administration for federal tenancy in the Greater Los Angeles area.

The Los Angeles Service Center's controlled real property inventory, totaling approximately 7.7 million square feet in 16 Federally-owned buildings, reside in Los Angeles and Orange Counties. Mr. Davis is responsible for facility operation and project execution for these buildings. Mr. Davis is responsible for the development of strategic business plans for these assets and leads the analysis of short and long term strategic decisions concerning agency placement, the maximization of customer satisfaction, facility revenue & expense allocation, as well as the preservation of historic public assets.

The Los Angeles Service Center's realty and lease administration responsibilities include strategic support and oversight to the placement of Federal Agencies within commercial leases, in addition to the contract enforcement of services rendered at these locations. This territory encompasses the greater Los Angeles area including Los Angeles County, Orange County, Riverside County, San Bernardino County and San Luis Obispo County. The lease inventory consists of approximately 300 leases totaling 4.7 million rentable square feet.

Prior to joining GSA, Mr. Davis worked in various capacities of real property, building management, project management and construction management. He successfully interfaced with property owners, architects, engineers, consultants and tenants to handle all facets of design and construction for both internal and external customers. While managing multiple, complex projects in Southern California, a wide variety of construction and engineering problems were solved under his direction. He provided leadership and guidance for two decades to both private sector and government entities in the real property arena. Mr. Davis attended Claremont McKenna College studying a B.A. in Management Engineering as well as the University of Southern California studying a B.S. in Mechanical Engineering.



CDR Steven Porter, FEB Chair Elect, is the Director of the FDA Los Angeles District Office of the U.S. Food & Drug Administration (FDA). He is also the Director of Division IV of the Office of Pharmaceutical Quality Operations within the FDA Office of Regulatory Affairs and a Commander in the U.S. Public Health Service (USPHS). CDR Porter serves as administrator of ten FDA properties throughout Arizona and southern California and provides oversight for FDA-regulated drug facilities across thirteen western states. Prior to his appointment as District Director in May 2016, CDR Porter served FDA in a variety of capacities including: Deputy District Director, Emergency Response Coordinator, Recall

Coordinator and Consumer Safety Officer. Throughout his career, he has issued over 750 Warning Letters and Recall Classification Letters to non-compliant industry and has been recognized multiple times for exemplary performance in the protection of public health. CDR Porter is an active Health Services Officer and has served as a Rapid Deployment Force Deputy Medical Records Chief, as Vice-President of the Commissioned Officer Association Southern California. Prior to joining the federal government, CDR Porter was an Environmental Health Specialist for the Louisville Metro Department of Public Health and Wellness and retains his certification as a Registered Sanitarian for the Commonwealth of Kentucky. He has served on the faculty of the Galen College of Nursing, the College of Lake County and Morton College and was the Program Coordinator for the Indiana Tobacco Retailer Inspection Program. CDR Porter holds a Bachelor of Arts in Biology from the University of Louisville and a Master's in Public Health from Indiana University – Bloomington.



Linda G. Gonzalez, FEB Vice Chair, is the Regional Director of the Federal Mediation Conciliation Service (FMCS), Southwest Region. RD Gonzalez has the responsibility for ensuring that FMCS' primary charge to mediate collective bargaining negotiations in the private, Federal and public sectors is carried out within the Southwestern United States and Pacific Islands. FMCS is an independent agency created by Congress in 1947 with the explicate objective of "assisting parties to labor disputes affecting commerce to settle such disputes through conciliation and mediation". FMCS provides comprehensive conflict resolution services in five major areas: collective bargaining mediation; grievance mediation; relationship development training; ADR services to government entities and education, outreach and advocacy.

With an extensive labor relations background of more than 30 years, MS Gonzalez has mediated EEO complaints and other inter-personal conflicts using ADR processes. She has conducted skills training in dispute resolution; mediation/facilitation; and cultural communication in the workplace. Utilizing her bilingual skills she has conducted training and mediations serving the Spanish speaking workforce in Southern California. She is also recognized for her work focused on mediation of complex, multi-party negotiations such as regulatory negotiations for Federal government agencies and Native American tribes and/or tribal organizations. Prior to joining FMCS, Ms. Gonzalez worked as a labor investigator and hearing officer with the Federal Labor Relations Authority (FLRA), a regulatory federal agency and also served as a local president for the American Federation of Government Employees, one of the largest Federal government unions.

Ms. Gonzalez is a graduate of Pepperdine University and completed her graduate work at Cal State University, Los Angeles in labor relations and public administration. Ms. Gonzalez is a native of Los Angeles, California and continues to live and contribute to the greater Los Angeles labor-management community.
